EUSBSR "sectors" crucial for Polish Regions

- research and innovation
 - Create the Baltic Sea Fund for Innovation and Research
 - Develop a regional foresight programme
- internal market, entrepreneurship, SMEs
 - Remove remaining single market barriers
 - Develop deeper cooperation on environmental technology
- internal and external transport links
 - Develop the Baltic Motorways of the Seas network
 - Complete the agreed priority transport infrastructures
 (e. g. the TEN-T Priority Projects no. 23 i 25)
- natural zones and biodiversity
 - Create marine protected areas
- education, tourism and health
 - Promote the cultural heritage and the unique landscapes













Stereotypes...

- The main issue in the EUSBSR is protection and improvement of the BSR natural environment
- Implementation of the EUSBSR should concentrate on infrastructural investments, mainly concerning transport
- The main role in the EUSBSR implementation should be played by **EU structural funds**



Expectations...

- 1. Not only **Cohesion Policy** involved
 - → the Strategy is an opportunity for effective coordination of different EU policies
- 2. More focus on **regulatory framework** in the EUSBSR
 - \rightarrow effective implementation of all single market rules
- 3. New approach to territorial cooperation
 - → possible new form of ETC programme for the BSR

- Preparation for possible **financial instrument** for the EUSBSR after 2013
