# "The Espoo Convention"

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# Espoo Convention's requirements

- sets out obligations of Parties to assess significant environmental impacts of certain activities
- requires Parties to notify and consult each other on projects under considerations that are likely to have a significant adverse environmental impact across boundaries
- Parties of Origin have responsibilities towards Affected Parties



## Organisation

- Convention Secretariat in Geneva
- Point of Contact in Party handles practical issues as notification and consultations
- Focal Point in Party has comprehensive role closer to political level
- Meeting of Parties every 3-4 year
- Working group (Parties, Secretariat, NGOs) meet one or two times a year in Geneva







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#### **Protocol on Strategic Environmental** Assessment to the Convention

- SEA Protocol done in Kiev 2003, in force **July 2010**
- Obliges Parties to carry out an SEA for certain plans and programmes which are likely to have significant environmental effects
- Requires Parties to have public participation in assessments and transboundary consultations when plan/programme is likely to have such transboundary effects



#### **Status of Protocol ratification**

### **Baltic Sea Region cooperation**

- Subregional cooperation an activity in Convention's work plan for two periods between Meeting of the Partie

- Three meetings with Baltic Sea Region countries held in Stockholm, Copenhagen and Vilnius
- -Next meeting in March 2011 in Espoo, Finland
- Baltic Sea Region cooperation proved very rewarding





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
