






#### Cities and urban areas in Poland

Major cities: Warsaw (capital city), Katowice Conurbation, Kraków


**Role of major cities in country growth:** about 51% of national GDP in 16 voivodeship capitals' areas **Polycentric spatial and functional structure of the settlement system**

- Ist draft of NUP (April 2014) an informal broad public debate on Urban Policy and the future of Polish cities lasted from April to September 2014
- > 3 thematic **regional conferences** to discuss the contents of each thematic areas
- conferences, events and bilateral meetings (organized by MID, cities & organizations)
- > 2nd draft of NUP formal intergovernmental and public consultations (Aug.- Sept. 2015)

#### **National Urban Policy**

document setting out the planned activities of government regarding urban policy, taking into account the objectives and directions set out in the medium-term national development strategy and a national strategy of regional development

expression of territorially targeted development policy, corresponding to the specific needs of the territories (NSRD NSDC, the Treaty of Lisbon, Leipzig Charter, the Europe 2020)

#### Actors

- government institutions,
- Iocal government units,
- ➤ citizens,
- business, science and non-governmental entities,
- ➤ government corporations and bodies representing the functional urban areas (unions, associations, etc.).

increasing the efficiency, comprehensiveness and complementarity of activities



### **Major challenges**

- create compact, friendly, low carbon and energy efficiency city
- improvement of spatial development in urban areas and to prevent suburbanisation
- use of the potential of the urban centers and their functional areas to create growth and jobs and sustainable development
- prevention of socio-economic and spatial degradation of urban areas
- improvement of the quality of management and co-operation in urban areas
- development of transport infrastructure, including public transport in urban areas














### DEVELOPMENT OF SPACE

- the active role of municipal authorities
- adopting high-quality local plans,
- reducing urban sprawl,
- eliminating visual chaos,
- housing rehabilitation,
- preventing illegal construction
- development of high quality urban space









### **SOCIAL PARTICIPATION**

- City open for a dialog,
- creating an appropriate "climate" for cooperation,
- priorities for the development of participation processes: education, attractive and active methods of cooperation and public consultations, building responsibility and concern for the common good, evaluation and monitoring.





### TRANSPORT & URBAN MOBILITY



- sustainable urban mobility,
- behavioral change communication a reversal of the trend of increasing use of car,
- prioritization of public transport & improving conditions for pedestrians and bicycle,
- integration of transport systems, traffic management systems, intelligent transport systems,
- limiting the 'transport intensity' of cities,
- spatial development of cities and their transportation services.





## LOW-CARBON & ENERGY EFFICIENCY



- the implementation of the provisions of climate and energy package,
- modernization of structures and implement policies to better adapt to the changing conditions of energy supply,
- strategies for low-carbon economy,
- energy efficiency of buildings,
- the need for efficient management of natural resources and environment,
- carbon efficiency and behavior change,





### REGENERATION



- regeneration as a "tailor-made" process for the most degraded areas covered by regeneration programs,
- comprehensiveness, complementarity, interdisciplinarity, integration of actions in the field of economic and social development, housing
- diagnosis  $\rightarrow$  vision  $\rightarrow$  selection of actions determine the sources of financing
- monitoring and evaluation
- knowledge center on regeneration





### **INVESTMENT POLICY**



- the balance between long-distance plans and rational, cost-effective policy of spending and investment,
- including urban investments in the city long-term strategy for urban development,
- adequate preparation of investment,
- the impact of investments on the city,
- knowledge centers, pilot projects, expert assistance,







## ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- comprehensive realistic an idea for a development, related with local potentials and its consistent implementation
- identify and develop local specializations defining directions of development of the local labor market, education, technology and innovation
- encouraging businesses to explore and implement innovate solutions
- strengthening local business institutions, especially in small towns
- taking care of the image and identity of the city and to promote it among entrepreneurs, investors and tourists





## ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION & ADAPTATION TO CLIMATE CHANGE



- improving the environment in cities
- promotion of green areas as an important element of the urban structure
- the important role of spatial planning
- water management
- restoration of degraded land (associated with regenration)
- the relationship of adaptation measures for energy efficiency
- plans for adaptation to climate change in urban areas

- aging
- shrinking population of cities
- comprehensive, integrated strategic planning taking into account demographic trends
- friendly ...
- issues regarding. Housing (the availability of housing for different social groups, social housing sector)
- optimizing the functioning of cities with declining populations





## MANAGEMENT IN URBAN AREAS



- cooperation in urban functional areas: the principle of partnership and multilevel governance
- ensuring the coherence of actions of government institutions with the directions set by NUP
- review and analysis of the finances of local government units
- integration of municipal strategic documents
- integration and coordination of activities for greater synergy and efficiency of public spending
- technologies in city management & "smart city"
