European Landscape Convention

- "Landscape" means an area, as perceived by people, whose character is the result of the action and interaction of natural and/or human factors;
- 20 out 21 EU countries with a coastline have signed the European Landscape Cpnvention – plus other European countries which are not EU member (eg. Montenegro, Ukraine, Turkey)



Marinescapes?!

Marinescapes are marine and coastal landscapes as perceived by people

The marinescapes of the Baltic Basin are a shared cultural and natural heritage, fundamental to the life of communities on all levels, and a source of opportunities for secure and predictable renewable energy, future food needs, medicines, raw materials and sustainable economic activity and jobs in many sectors.



European Union

EU has no territorial competence, but a territorial agenda

- Blue Growth / Maritime Spatial Planning Directive
- Environmental Impact Assessment Directive / Green infrastructure
- Regional strategies / Urban agenda
- Sectoral policies like Energy
- Integrated Coastal Zone Management



Baltic Sea a mare nostrum

It is not a naturale divede, it is connecting people living on it's shores

Shared history and heritage – natural and cultural

Communities around the Baltic Sea facing similar or same challenges

Need for a transnational, Baltic Sea wide change process towards more sustainability which has to improve the living conditions



Challenges beside crisis

Economy: job loss, de-industrialization, increasing transport, energy transition

Ecology: biodiversity loss, effects on ecosystem level, impact from long-lasting pollutions, loss of natural heritage

Social: loss of cultural diversity, changing demography, imigration, gentrification, growing social unequality



Get involved: Looking for the best

The European Union promotes in general the competition for best ideas, best and sustainable practice in many fields.

CIVILSCAPE tries to promote this kind of competition for most promising ideas and practical actions in the field of marinescape planning, management and protection.

In this way we foster awareness for the diversity of ideas, approaches and solutions among our members and partners.



How people get involved

People must have a say on their marinescapes is the simple essence of the European Landscape Convention.

Today people are much more involved in planning and management processes which have been in the past the professional domain of experts.

As voters people make a choice that influence anyway many marinescapes issues.



Marinescape approach as a chance

CIVILSCAPE stated from the beginning that a Collective Challenge on landscapes will need a Collective Answer.

Key question:

How to involve an increasing number of people in a more sustainable marinescape protection, planning and management?

Dutch EU Presidency 2016: involve an increasing number is key challenge for marine spatial planning



Baltic Marinescape Observatory

- 1. Awareness raising and education
- 2. Monitoring and observation, analysis
- 3. Facilitating participatory processes on management, planning and protection
- 4. Recommendation and consulting

Following the Recommendation of the Council of Ministers on the Implemnetation of the European Landscape Convention



Baltic Marinescape Observatory

- Observatory as potential joined project
- Observatory could consist of a network of partners supported by an associated infrastructure
- Observatory could support governments, nongovernmental organisations and communities in the sustainable development, protection, management and planning of Baltic Marinescapes.
