








Territorial cohesion perspective of the Baltic Sea Region in 2030




- Well integrated and coherent macro-region with overcome divides

- Integrated land and sea space planning and management
- Maritime spatial planning principles alleviating potential sea use conflicts for the present and future generations

MSP in Baltic Sea Region








Joint Efforts in MSP

MSP Roadmap 2013-2020

Draw up and apply maritime spatial plans throughout the Baltic Sea Region by 2020 which are coherent across borders and apply the ecosystem approach

Necessary steps:

- Ecosystem approach in MSP
- Trans-boundary consultations and cooperation in MSP
- Public participation
- Information and data for MSP
- Education for MSP
- National and macro-regional frameworks for MSP
- Evaluation and follow-up





MSP Roadmap 2013-2020

Implementation:

- Guideline for the implementation of ecosystem-based approach in MSP in the Baltic Sea area (adopted in 2015)
- Guidelines on transboundary consultations, public participation and co-operation (adopted in 2016)
- Baltic Sea Region MSP Data Expert Sub-Group (launched in 2015)
- Assesment of the Implementation (2018/2019)



The MSP country fiches are a reliable source of data on the MSP status in the Baltic Sea countries and Norway. The fiches contain maps and information on the sea areas, national laws and regulations, governance, contact information, existing spatial plans and plans under development as well as information on other MSP related developments.

The updating of the fiches is coordinated by the Joint HELCOM-VASAB Maritime Spatial Planning Working Group based on an agreed procedure.

- VASAB teamed up with the Baltic University Programme to develop capacity building activities for MSP professionals







