

2. General information on legislation

Denmark does not have a specific Planning Act for its sea space. The work is in process and an Act is expected to be adopted by the spring 2016.

Sea-based activities are regulated by a large number of sectoral laws, e.g. the Marine Environment Protection Act, the Raw Materials Act, the Subsoil Act, the Continental Shelf Act, the Electricity Supply Act, the Harbour Act and the Fishery Act.

Consequently, authority over the coastal zone is dispersed among different sectors and different administrative levels of decision-making.

The Planning Act only regulates the terrestrial part of the Danish territory. In regards to the coastal zone, activities are regulated by specific paragraphs of the Planning Act.

The coming spatial plan will apply to both the territorial Sea and the EEZ.
