# Background

HELCOM and VASAB are co-coordinators of Horizontal Action (HA) Spatial Planning of the EU Strategy for the Baltic Sea Region (EUSBSR). The joint HELCOM-VASAB MSP Working Group acts as the steering committee for the HA Spatial Planning concerning MSP issues. Both Secretariats assist the WG in this role, by e.g. keeping the group informed of activities related to the (EUSBSR) and HA Spatial Planning (such as funding opportunities and meetings) and representing the HA in various meetings and processes as needed.

# Developments and activities related to the EUSBSR and HA Spatial Planning March 2020

HELCOM and VASAB are co-coordinators of Horizontal Action (HA) Spatial Planning of the EU Strategy for the Baltic Sea Region (EUSBSR). The joint HELCOM-VASAB MSP Working Group acts as the steering committee for the HA Spatial Planning concerning MSP issues. Both Secretariats assist the WG in this role, by e.g. keeping the group informed of activities related to the (EUSBSR) and HA Spatial Planning (such as funding opportunities and meetings) and representing the HA in various meetings and processes as needed.

## Revision process of the EUSBSR Action Plan

EC has initiated the Revision process of the EUSBSR Action Plan in order to consider achievements and challenges for both thematic and governance issues, the relevance of Strategy's objectives, sub-objectives and targets, as well as set the future tasks.

In this regard, joint HELCOM-VASAB MSP WG emphasised the role of HELCOM VASAB MSP WG group in the EUSBSR framework during its 18th Meeting in Hamburg on 27th of March 2019 and concluded on importance of coordinated role of the group and the need to keep the Horizontal Action in the Strategy.

The revision timetable has been postponed from what was anticipated earlier. On the 1st of November HACs/PACs submitted the first drafts of PA/HA descriptions filled into template provided by EC DG Regio and external expert COWI together with EUSBSR National Coordinators. At the Nacional Coordinators meeting in Helsinki, 27-28 November 2019 it was decided to give HACs/PACs a new round for contributions. VASAB and HELCOM Secretariats jointly have prepared a proposition for updated action plan and circulated it for feedback to both steering groups. Another National Coordinators meeting took place on 4th to 5th February in Riga, after that minor adjustments were required in HA SP description. Secretariats have updated the description and submitted it to the EC DG Regio. Indicative further steps regarding revising the Action Plan are following:

- At this point EC DG Regio jointly with the Presidency (Finland) are preparing a Proposal of the Presidency which will include changes also in the general description of the Strategy not only in the HA and PA descriptions.
- Proposal will have to be approved by the National Coordinators (next NCs Meeting indicatively planned for 30<sup>th</sup> of March).
- After approval from the NCs, proposal will be put forward for the Commission consultation and adoption as a Commission Staff Working Document (SWD) (aim is to adopt the Action Plan until the end of May 2020).

The overall goal of the HA "Spatial Planning" is to increase territorial cohesion in the Baltic Sea Region. In 2030, the Region shall be a better-integrated and more coherent macro-region that has reduced socio-economic development divides between its individual parts and has turned global challenges into assets. The current version of the revised EUSBSR Action plan for HA Spatial Planning has two actions:

- Action 1: Strengthening territorial cohesion in the BSR through land-based spatial planning
- Action 2: Ensuring coherent maritime spatial plans throughout the Baltic Sea:

### Action 2: Ensuring coherent maritime spatial plans throughout the Baltic Sea

**Description:** The Regional Baltic MSP Roadmap 2013-2020, along with VASAB LTP and HELCOM Baltic Sea Action Plan sets the framework for MSP cooperation and defines the necessary steps to achieve the goal to draw up and apply maritime spatial plans throughout the BSR which are coherent across borders and apply the ecosystem approach.

#### Project (s) and other action (s) are planned within this action:

Current **Regional Baltic MSP Roadmap** includes an agreed goal: "to draw up and apply maritime spatial plans throughout the Baltic Sea Region by 2020 which are coherent across borders and apply ecosystem-based approach". According to the Work plan 2020-2021 of the HELCOM-VASAB MSP Working Group, the elaboration of new Roadmap for 2020+ will be carried out by 2021. In the period after 2020 focus of the activities on MSP will move from preparation of the plans to their implementation and to follow up of effectiveness.

There will be important updates for the overall policy frameworks. An update of the **HELCOM Baltic Sea Action Plan** is going on and is expected to be adopted by the end of 2021. Also, a possible update of the **VASAB LTP** is currently being discussed.

**BSR MSP Data group** works on establishing the joint BSR MSP webmap where adopted maritime spatial plans in the Baltic Sea will be available.

EU Commission's DG MARE, Interreg BSR Programme, joint Baltic Sea research and development Programme (BONUS), Interreg Central Baltic Programme, VASAB's and HELCOM's own budget

## Follow-up on funding activities

#### Interreg BSR Programme -

- Regular project calls all funds within the current financial framework 2014-2020 are committed. No further calls are planned.
- Calls for the project platforms no further platform project calls are planned.
- **2<sup>nd</sup> Call for the extension stage projects** was open from 1 October 2019 until 27 February 2020 for Programme priorities No.1-3. No further calls are planned.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Seed Money Call is open from 5 Nobember 2019 23 March 2020 in order to "bridge" current financial framework 2014-2020 with the next one. In the 1<sup>st</sup> phase of application (submission of the project idea to the relevant HAC/PAC) HA Spatial Planning received and recommended 3 project ideas (project idea BlueBioSites was MSP related) to the MA/JS for further development. In the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase pre-selected applications are developed and submitted to the MA/JS.
- Calls for coordination of EUSBSR Request for prolongation of technical assistance projects of HACs/PACs have to be submitted to the MA/JS on 27<sup>th</sup> March. Necessary procedures have been carried out to request prolongation of HASPS 3 project.

Interreg Central Baltic Programme (EE, LV, SE, FI, Åland) – 5<sup>th</sup> Call was open from 15 August – 15 October 2019 for all Specific Objectives. 20 projects have been approved for funding.

Interreg South Baltic Programme 2014-2020 (DE, DK, LT, PL, SE) - Currently, no call of the Interreg South Baltic Programme 2014-2020 is open. The decision about the schedule and scope for the next call will be announced after the Monitoring Committee meeting in April 2020.

*Interreg Europe* – all funds have been allocated to projects. There will be no more calls within current financial framework 2014-2020.

EASME/EMFF – at this point no information about further calls is available.
