

Offshore wind energy - an untapped potential in the Baltic region ?

20 GW of offshore wind installed in European waters

2 GW in the Baltic Sea

Germany 1,074 MW

Denmark 872 MW

Sweden 192 MW

Finland 68 MW



9 GW by 2030 could be deployed in the Baltic Sea85 GW by 2050 (Wind Europe predictions 2019)

The cumulative potential capacity identified in the Baltic Sea by the European Commission (BEMIP Final Report, 2019) **exceeds 93 GW**





Why offshore wind workshop?


- How can we now ensure that these future targets are met?


