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



Vision and Strategies around the Baltic Sea

2030: Territorial cohesion perspective







Draft New Regional MSP Roadmap 2021-2030

Goal:

strengthening the joint effort and coherence throughout the Baltic Sea Region to implement Maritime Spatial Plans, aiming for sustainable development and building a sound basis for an adaptive MSP process applying the ecosystem-based approach

Objectives:

O1: Implementation of Maritime Spatial Plans builds knowledge base for the new MSP cycle

O2: MSP improves <u>regional policy coherence</u>

O3: MSP contributes to achieving progress towards good environmental status of the Baltic Sea set in the Baltic Sea Action Plan

O4: MSP contributes to sustainable blue economy

O5: MSP contributes to <u>climate change mitigation</u>, <u>adaptation</u> and increased resilience of the Baltic Sea Region

HELCOM-VASAB MSP Working Group frameworks on stakeholders involvement I

Baltic Sea MSP Principles:

Participation and Transparency

All relevant authorities and stakeholders, including coastal municipalities as well as national and regional bodies, should be <u>involved</u> in maritime spatial planning initiatives <u>at the earliest possible stage</u>

HELCOM-VASAB MSP Working Group frameworks on stakeholders involvement II

Guidelines on Transboundary Consultations, Public Participation and Cooperation:

- Aim to ensure stakeholder involvement within countries, across the borders and on Pan-Baltic scale
- Specify stakeholders consultations steps
- Propose steps in organising stakeholder involvement in transboundary consultation process
- Suggest engagement of stakeholders best at national level and well organised stakeholder groups at Pan-Baltic level
- Underline that subsidiarity principle has to be maintained.
