Mapping the Blue Economy (BE) in the case study regions (LV, PL, DE, EE, DK, SE)

 Central goal: Monitoring employment and gross value added in BE and its sectors

Advantages:

- Status quo of regional BE
- Comparison with other regions
- Development over time
- Assessment of effectiveness of policy measures
- Input-output effects

- Structural Business Statistics (NACE four-digit level)
- Statistics on manufactured goods (PRODCOM)
- Rystad Energy UCube data (Offshore oil and gas)
- Tourism Satellite Accounts



Problems of measuring BE at the regional level

Problems at regional level

- No EU-wide NACE four-digit level statistics at NUTS2/NUTS3 level
- Data provision by regional/national statistical offices
 - Not possible due to anonymizations
 - High costs
 - Months for preparation

Alternative ways of measuring BE

- Adjust BE definition such that it can be monitored using Structural Business Statistics available at the regional level
- Require regional statistical offices to report aggregate BE employment data to Eurostat
- Combine official sectoral data with information from surveys among companies (Katila et al. 2019)
- Measuring entities instead of jobs or gross value added (Szejgiec-Kolenda & Zaucha 2019)
