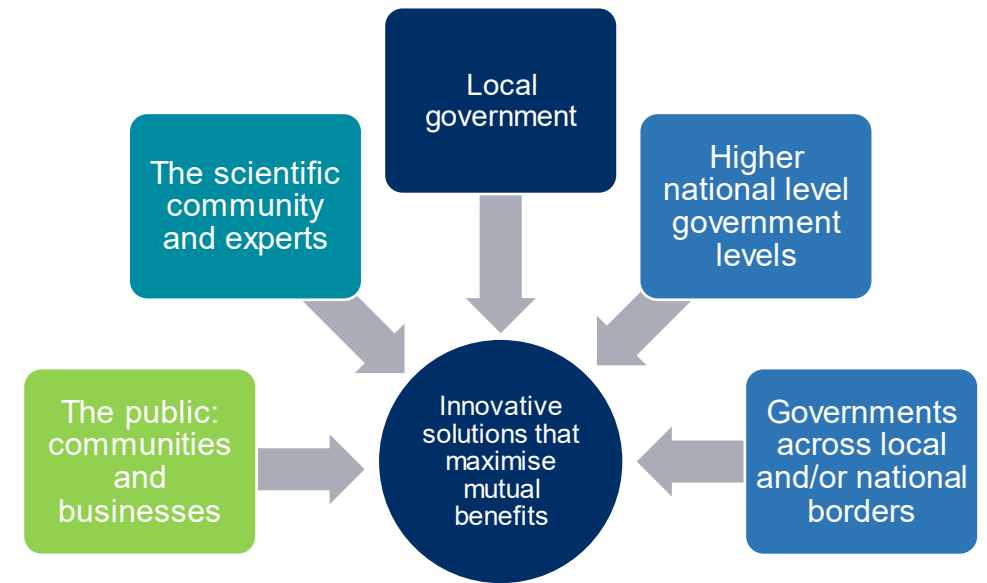

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# Our multi-level governance definition

Collaborative and cooperative way of innovation-focused governance facilitated across all relevant governance levels within and beyond the borders of the governable territory in intersection with non-government stakeholders. (Base sources: Marquardt, 2017; Kull and Tatar, 2015; Pittman and Armitage, 2016).





# The Agenda profile

- *The intended audience:* government level stakeholders in planning processes within the BSR.
- *The aim of the Agenda:* to guide governance actions in the BSR towards extended cooperation and collaboration.
- The Agenda consists of:
  - Background literature and key policy review,
  - A set of principles to guide MLG processes,
  - A collection of steps/goalposts that are envisioned to be part of the agenda within MLG processes.

# Outline of key principles



The governance process should:

- Be **niche** to fill a gap in governance/update it,
- Rely on a **place-based approach**,
- Reflect **cyclicity** of processes,
- **Respect the heritage** of the governable spaces and communities,
- Allow planning for **realistic timelines**,
- Ensure **measurability and trackability** of processes from the outset.



# The steps

- **Step 1:** Background policy review
- **Step 2:** Scoping governance and stocktaking
- **Step 3:** Stakeholder recognition and mapping
- **Step 4:** Creating a governance lead team
- **Step 5:** Strategising/Scenario building/Solution modelling
- **Step 6:** Multi-level assessment and mediation among stakeholders
- **Step 7:** Adoption and implementation
- **Step 8:** Monitoring of problem definition-based (measurable) indicators
- **Step 9:** Learning from the results

# Land-Sea Act project cases in the Agenda

- The project cases:
  - are mostly **exploratory** in nature,
  - served as a **basis for any adjustments** in already experience-based steps,
  - provided materials for **analysing the issues and opportunities** within the land-sea interface,
  - a **source of tips** and an **exploration of methods and tools**.
